



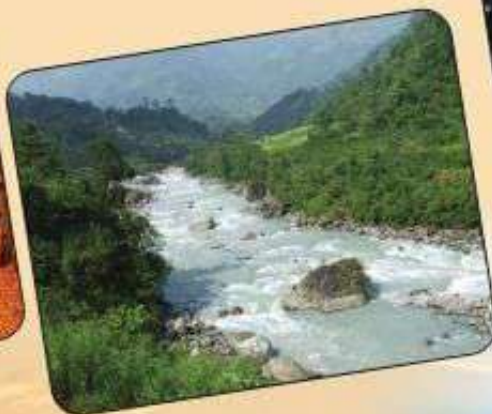

Netarhat: The Queen of Chotanagpur

Netarhat is a hill station in Latehar district in the Indian state of Jharkhand. The hill station is among the highest points of the Chotanagpur plateau. It is known for its natural beauty of hills, forest and waterfalls. Located at a height of 1,128 metres (3,701 ft) in the Pat region of the Chota Nagpur Plateau, Netarhat plateau is about 4 miles (6.4 km) long and 2.5 miles wide. It consists of crystalline rocks and has a summit capped with sandstone, trap, or laterite. The region of Netarhat is covered with Sal, Kendu, Mahua, and Eucalyptus trees and the most beautiful sunrise and sunset point.

Netarhat is located 156 kilometres west of Ranchi, the state capital, 118 kilometres from Daltonganj and 82 kilometres from district headquarter Latehar.

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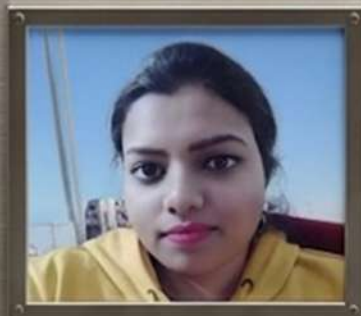

Scientific Abstract Submission Guidelines

Abstract Submission



- Accepted abstracts will be presented either in award paper/e-poster session (subject to the decision taken by the scientific committee). The authors have to specify the category in which they wish to present at the time of submission.
- Since all the abstracts are supposed to be original works being presented for the first time in any scientific forum, unlike lectures, it is imperative that the subject of these papers must not have been presented or published before.
- The names of the authors and their affiliations should be sent in a separate page along with letter of affiliation from HOD and also a declaration regarding any conflict of interest.
- A written undertaking, signed by the presenting author and authenticated by Departmental Head must be submitted, mentioning that- (a.) The case /study to be presented has not been presented elsewhere / submitted for presentation elsewhere. (b.) In case of a study, the presenting student has to be the principal investigator/ one of the co-investigators. copy of the letter of clearance from Institutional Ethics Committee or Receipt of Application for ethical clearance certificate, attested by the Departmental Head must be submitted in this case, In either case, the presenting author's name has to be present in the IEC letter / Application receipt, as Principal / Co - Investigator. All these documents are required as PDF/JPEG format. Hand written undertakings/ documents will not be accepted.
- Word limit for the abstract is maximum of 250 words in structured format. In case of studies: Title, Aims and Objectives, Materials and Methods, Results and Analysis, Discussion. In case of case reports : Title, Introduction, Case report, Discussion. The abstract will be summarily rejected if not submitted in proper format.
- For award paper:-
- 29 Sequence of the speakers will be determined by the scientific committee.
- The number of slides should not exceed 16. Title slide: Mention the title, name of the presenting author, conflict of interest and a self-declaration stating that this work has neither been presented nor published elsewhere.
- Any questions, for clarification, are allowed only from the judges and after the presentation.
- For Free Paper-
- Same as Award paper
- For e-poster session:-
- The number of slides should not exceed 5 (One each for Introduction and Objective, Methods, Result, Discussion and Conclusion).
Mention of affiliation or co-authors can be done and mention of conflict of interest and source of support is mandatory.
- Hyperlinks and animations are not allowed. Avoid use of video files. Maximum size of ppt permitted is 15 MB. Avoid full sentences and excessive text in general. Bulleted items with key words are preferable.
- Essential Requirements:-
- Must be a registered PGT delegate and a Provisional Life Member of IADVL, Jharkhand
- Letter of affiliation from HOD.
- Undertaking of Abstract²⁶ Submission and Declaration of conflict of⁶ interest

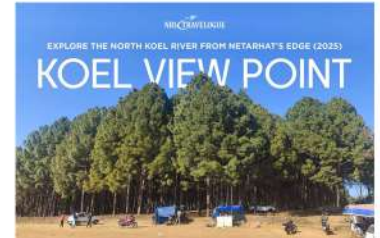

Betla was one of the first national parks in India to become a tiger reserve under Project Tiger in 1974. It was declared a national park in 1986. It is spread over 226.32 km² area in Palamu and Latehar district and is a part of Palamu Tiger Reserve, which comprises a total area of 1,129.93 km². The tourist zone area is 53 km² in the buffer zone. The park has a diverse ecosystem and an abundance of wild animals. The national park is home to a variety of wild animals and birds.

Koel View Point It is highly popular as a sunrise point, where you can watch the early morning sun light up the valley and glimmers on the river surface. This viewpoint sits on a cliffside amidst dense chir pine forests and is famous for providing a sweeping, panoramic view of the Chotanagpur Plateau and the distant meandering Koel River. The Panoramic View: Offers a vast aerial view of lush green valleys, steep hills, and the silvery thread of the North Koel River flowing far below. Pine Forest Walk: Reaching the edge of the cliff requires a short, refreshing walk through rows of towering, aromatic pine trees.



Lodh Falls (also known as Budha Ghagh) is the highest waterfall in Jharkhand and the 21st highest in India, cascading from a spectacular height of 143 metres. Tucked deep inside the lush green forests of the Palamu Tiger Reserve in the Latehar district, this tiered, multi-step natural wonder is fed by the Burha River. Waterfall is post-monsoon period, the river is fully charged, the cascade is at its most majestic, and the surrounding plateau forests are incredibly vibrant and green. It is located about 61 km from the popular hill station of Netarhat.

Lower Ghaghri Falls is a majestic 320-foot (98-meter) cascade located deep within the dense forests of the Latehar district in Jharkhand, India. Recognized as the 33rd highest waterfall in India, it stands out as one of the most prominent natural attractions near the hill station of Netarhat. Typically open for visitors from 08:00 AM to 05:00 PM daily. Best Time to Visit: The post-monsoon period from October to December offers optimal water volume and vibrant green surroundings. Accessible via a scenic 10-kilometre drive or trek through hilly forest terrain from Netarhat town.

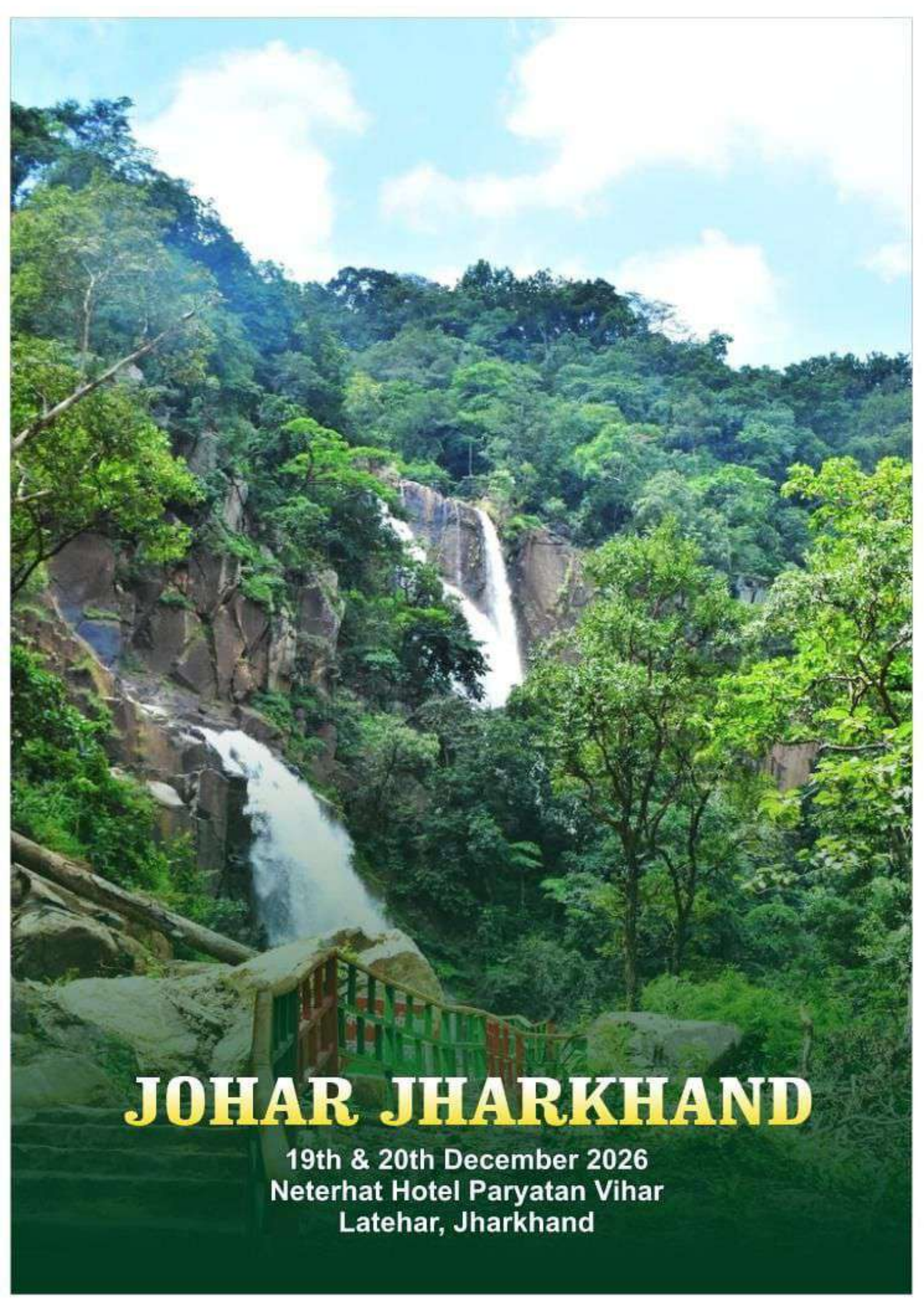


Magnolia Sunset Point in Netarhat Situated approximately 10 kilometres from the Netarhat bus stand, this cliffside vantage point is famous for its panoramic views of the Chotanagpur Plateau. The historical lore surrounding the site has been preserved by the local administration to promote tourism in the region. The site is highly frequented for its clear, multi-hued sunsets over the surrounding pine and bamboo forests.

Netarhat Residential School (Netarhat Vidyalaya) is a premier, government-run boarding school located in the serene hill station of Netarhat in the Latehar district of Jharkhand, India. Established on 15 November 1954 in undivided Bihar, it was envisioned by Bihar's first Chief Minister, Shri Krishna Singh, and his deputy, Anugrah Narayan Sinha, to create a center of educational excellence. It is famously referred to as "The Last Gurukul" due to its strict adherence to traditional Indian values, self-reliance, and holistic. The school stands out for blending modern education with ancient traditions. Students live across 21 Ashrams, under the care of House Masters and House Mothers.
